On May 6th MATA pilots Ian Rojas and Joel Johnson arrived in a beautiful Cessna 172, after a 2-day trip flying up from Phoenix. Ian acted as safety pilot while Joel practiced instrument flying under the "hood," a device which limits vision to inside the cockpit. Joel logged 13

hours toward the 40 hours of instrument time and 50 hours of cross-country time required for the Instrument Rating. Ian also logged the time



toward the 250 hours required for a Commercial Pilot certificate.
