Director's Corner

Over my many years in Africa and now with MATA, I have been asked to write two-year plans and even five-year plans. It is always hard to make these predictions because we cannot even be sure about tomorrow.

The example Jesus gave was the rich man who made plans to build bigger barns. He did not live to the next morning. In the 4th chapter of James, verses 13 through 15, we are reminded

again that our life is like a vapor, here today, gone tomorrow. It also tells us in our planning to say, "Lord willing we shall live and do this or that."

So, in five years is it a realistic goal for MATA to double the number of students?

So, in five years is it a realistic goal for MATA to double the number of students? That would be 40-45 actively in training. Of that number could we expect to have 5 each year going out to the mission field? Is this possible? Yes, Lord willing, if we have enough men and women come who really love the Lord, have a servant's heart, and are ready to do

whatever it costs to be a pilot for Christ in a foreign country or maybe Alaska or Northern Canada.

We have the facilities and aircraft right now to have at least 50% more students. What is keeping you from helping us reach this goal? Some of you will say, "I am too old, or..." and the list goes on. You can all pray for us. Some of you have funds that you could give, so we can keep our cost to the students much more affordable. Finishing the program debtfree enables a prospective missionary pilot to make application with a sending organization as soon as he or she has met the required experience level. We have highlighted several in this letter who are the kind of pilot we need more of.
